# Call for Expressions of Interest for VicTAG Projects

VicTAG is calling for expressions of interest to undertake funded projects that will benefit patients and the wider membership.

## Project I

# Review of the Register of Emergency and Life Saving Drugs

Applications close Friday 4th November 2011. Project completion date February 2012.

VicTAG seeks expressions of interest to undertake a review of the content and presentation of the Register of Emergency and Life Saving Drugs.

The Register serves as a guide to aid hospital pharmacies in sourcing drugs in emergency situations. Hospitals may not hold certain drugs due to their rare use or high cost or have a need to access additional stock in high demand situations.

VicTAG has maintained the Register content and location guide on its website (<a href="www.victag.org.au">www.victag.org.au</a>) for many years.

The successful tenderer will:

- Provide a literature review and appraisal of systems to access emergency and life saving drugs both in Australia and overseas.
- Consult with the Victorian Poisons Information Centre and Toxicology Unit at Austin Health to determine current antidote recommendations and stock requirements.
- Consult with a range of metropolitan and rural pharmacists and emergency physicians and anaesthetists on their requirements for the Register.

 Provide recommendations on the format, accessibility and mechanisms to regularly update and maintain the Register. The Vic-TAG website is being redeveloped and recommendations can be included in the design process.

Funding available up to \$15,000.

#### Project 2

# A quality use of medicines or medication safety project that will benefit the wider membership of VicTAG

Applications close Friday 2nd December 2011.

This open topic project should address an area of known risk for the operation of Pharmacy or the Quality Use of Medicines. Reference to National or International standards or references to demonstrate the risk and the proposed action to address the risk (preferably an evidence-based approach) should be included in the proposal. Projects should be considered in the context of seed or pilot funding to demonstrate that a proposed intervention may be feasible across the healthcare system. Applicants are encouraged to collaborate with other hospitals to demonstrate applicability across metropolitan and rural settings.

Funding available up to \$20,000.
